On 14th November, more than 300 CAFOD campaigners joined our "Faith into Action" online event to learn and explore how to create a better post-pandemic world. Practical theologian, Sam Ewell, shared his journey and work in Brazil, and with our Campaign Manager, Liam Finn, we explored *Fratelli Tutti* and Pope Francis' call for "change through fundamental reform and major renewal."

We felt hugely inspired by the work of two young Catholic campaigners from Nigeria and Colombia, and heard about the importance of stepping up our campaigning work in 2021 from our Director of Advocacy, Neil Thorns, and Head of Campaigns, Aisha Dodwell. They explained the importance of the UK hosting both the G7 and the COP26 next year and set out the ways we hope to achieve change with our new **Reclaim Our Common Home** campaign.




2021 needs to be a year of transformation. Let us pray together, "A Prayer to the Creator"

Meet Andy...

Campaigns Volunteer, Andy Wansbury from Southwark, tells us how, even if we can't be in church, we can still live out our faith.

In the current pandemic, how are we to live out our faith without access to Mass and the sacraments? Attending Mass is a vitally important part of Catholic life, but for me, being a practising Catholic has always been more than just going to church on Sunday.

The roles we fulfil in church are both inside and outside of the building: some are a server, a choir member or a catechist, some are community leaders, emergency service and key workers, or campaigners for justice – as I am with CAFOD.

As a Campaign Volunteer Coordinator, I encourage and support volunteers like myself to take part in CAFOD's social justice campaigns, as well as campaign actively myself. Working for justice in this way and encouraging others to do the same forms part of my Christian life and service.
