

Happy Easter!

On the front of the Newsletter you will see the Easter Greeting which has been used from the earliest times of the Church, especially by our brothers and sisters of the Churches of the East, whether Catholic and Orthodox. To the greeting: "*Christ is risen*", the response: "*He is risen indeed*" is given. It is a beautiful custom which would be good for us to use more widely here, amongst the Churches and Christians of the West. The greeting underscores the importance of the Solemnity which we are celebrating and the centrality of Christ's Resurrection to our worldview, to everything we are and to everything we believe as Christians.

Easter Sunday is followed by the Easter Octave, which prolongs the celebration of the Sunday for eight days. The Easter Season itself lasts for 50 days and ends with the Solemnity of Pentecost on 23 May.

During this time we pray in particular for new members of the Church across the world who received the Sacrament of Baptism over Easter and, on the Fourth Sunday, for vocations to the Priesthood and to the Consecrated Life.

Coming to Church – "Hands/Face/Space"

When coming to church for services, please observe the social distancing rules, wear a face covering (unless you are exempt) and sanitise your hands frequently. Please also maintain an appropriate distance from others at all times, both inside the church and outside in the carpark.

If you would like to come to **Mass at the weekends**, please contact the Parish Office to book a place, either by telephone on weekdays between 10.00am-1.00pm, or by email. There is no need to book a place at a weekday Mass but, on arrival at church, please give your details to one of the stewards.
