Important Changes to Mass Attendance at Church

- There is no longer any need to book to attend the Saturday or Sunday Mass there. Please be respectful of other's space. "Please leave a space" cards are available at the entrance to church to be placed on a bench next to you if you would prefer that people not sit too close to you.
- As there is still a restricted number of spaces at **St Boniface** due to the size of the church and the limited ventilation, the booking system for the 11.30am Mass will continue for the time being.
- Continue to use the NHS Track and Trace QR codes. Stewards will still
 take your names to ensure we have a record in the event of the need to
 self-isolate, which remains a legal requirement. Additional contact details
 of those on our parish database will no longer be required. If you have not
 filled in a census form, or your details have since changed, census forms
 are available at the entrance to church.
- The "one way" system is no longer in place, but please follow the guidance of the stewards at the time for Holy Communion.
- Those who can are asked to continue to wear face coverings whilst in church. The congregation is asked not to remove face coverings when singing.
- Holy Communion will to be administered solely under one kind and, although it is permissible for people to receive Communion directly onto the tongue should they so wish, Communion on the hand is the recommended way of receiving Holy Communion as it presents less risk of cross infection.
