### November – Month of Prayer for the Dead



Throughout the month of November it is customary for us to pray in a more focussed way for those who have died. From 2 November there will be a pot in from of the altar for the names of family, loved ones and friends who have died. Mass on Friday 25 November will be celebrated for all these people and each will be prayed for by name at the Mass.

Many people we know – our neighbours, friends and work colleagues who are not Catholics or even people of any explicit faith at all - have also lost someone precious to them. This month is an opportunity for us to ask them sensitively whether they would like us to pray for that person. This is a gentle way of opening up a conversation about questions of death and life after death, and provides a context in which to share our Christian faith in the reality of the resurrection. These names can be added to the pot. A form is attached to the Newsletter for names, but any suitable piece of paper can be used.

### World Day of the Poor Novena and Reflections



The sixth World Day of the Poor will be celebrated by the Catholic Church next Sunday, 13 November, with the theme of "For your sakes Christ became poor" (2 Cor 8:9). Caritas Social Action Network (CSAN), the Bishops' Conference agency promoting domestic social action, in collaboration with Redemptorist Publications, has produced a <u>booklet</u> including a novena and daily reflections, which start on 1 November. Raymond Friel, CEO, CSAN, said: "The resources

we have gathered here are offered to the Catholic community as a way of deepening our encounter with those who are poor, of examining our own conscience about our lifestyles and how our faith is expressed in loving action."
