Pre-Christmas Octave: 17-24 December



The weekend marks the start of the second part of the Season of Advent when the Church's Liturgy is more directly focussed on the birth of the Messiah in Bethlehem more than 2000 years ago. Over these days, the ancient "O" Antiphons are sung as part of the service of Vespers or Evening Prayer of the Church and also used as Gospel Acclamations during Mass. No one

knows their exact origin, but they have been sung since at least the 5th Century. Each antiphon begins with a title of Christ taken from the Old Testament. The "O" which starts each Antiphon expresses symbolically both our heartfelt yearning for the return of the Lord and also the emptiness in our lives and in our world that can only be filled by the presence and action of the living God made manifest in Christ and at work within us and within the whole of creation through the power of the Holy Spirit. Do make the most of these last days of Advent to prepare yourself spiritually for the celebration of the Incarnation of the Lord. An additional hour for Confessions has been scheduled at St James next Saturday, 24 December, 10.30am-11.30am.

Synodal Journey - An Online Conversation about Safeguarding

Many across the Diocese and within our own parish have been involved in the synodal process. From the feedback both locally and nationally it has become apparent that some significant questions and issues were raised around safeguarding, ranging from disappointment and concern over the handling of past abuse, its impact on both individuals and the reputation of the Church, as well as concern over what still needs to be done moving forward.



More recently, we have seen the release of the final report from the Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse (IICSA), which itself highlighted the terrible and damaging impact on children and families caused by abusers, including within the Church. Whilst looking back, this paints a grim picture of society as a whole. Looking forward, both nationally and locally, there is a great deal of work being undertaken both in the voluntary and statutory sector to prevent abuse from occurring, and to work with and support those who have been hurt in the past. We as a Diocese are playing our part in that not only within the Church, but in wider society.

Being aware that many of you may have questions around how safe our Church is, the implications arising from the IICSA report for us, and about safeguarding and the synodal journey, the Diocesan Safeguarding Office will be hosting an online event which will be led by Robert Brown, the Diocesan Safeguarding Coordinator. The event will take place on Monday 9 January between 6.00pm-7.30pm.
