Sunday of the Word of God



On 30 September 2019, Pope Francis made the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time the "Sunday of the Word of God" to underline the importance of the Word of God in the life of the Church and to encourage the reading and study of the Scriptures. This year's theme is "*We proclaim what we have seen*", a guote from the First Letter of St John (1Jn1:3). A booklet has been produced by the Vatican Dicastery for Evangelisation which provides

a lot to reflect upon, especially from page 22 onwards, with regards to the Word of God in family and daily life. The Bishops in the USA have also produced <u>five videos</u> with some reflection questions to help deepen our understanding of the Scriptures: Who actually wrote the Bible?, What are the Synoptic Gospels?, What parts of the Bible are also read by our Jewish and Protestant Friends?, How is the Catholic approach to reading the Bible different than other approaches?, and How can I practice the Lectio Divina method of scriptural meditation?

Holocaust Memorial Day

Friday 27 January is the day for everyone to remember the six million Jews murdered in the Holocaust, and the millions of people killed under Nazi persecution, and in the genocides which followed in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur. The 27 January marks the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp. In the UK, thousands of local events and activities take place every year – each one an opportunity for people to reflect on those whose lives were changed beyond recognition, and to challenge prejudice, discrimination, and hatred in our own society today. On HMD, we all have a role to play to ensure that we learn the lessons of the past, to create a safer, better future.

The theme for Holocaust Memorial Day 2023 is '*ordinary people'*. Through this theme, we are invited to think about all the millions of ordinary victims of Nazi persecution and subsequent genocides. We are also prompted to think about how easy it is for 'ordinary people' to become perpetrators. In this light, today ordinary people must be alert to the dangers of antisemitism, racism and intolerance, and strive to combat the evil of genocide in our world. The Council of Christians and Jews has produced a useful <u>resource</u> to help observe this day.
