

This was inspired by conversations around last year's Racial Justice Sunday and Pope Francis' visit to Canada in July 2022 when he spoke about looking towards a future of 'justice, healing and reconciliation'. A <u>prayer</u> has been produced that can be used year-round as well as <u>questions for reflection</u>. There are also short videos for <u>Walking Together</u>, <u>Working Together</u> and <u>Praying Together</u>. There is a retiring collection at the end of Mass to support the work of the Catholic Association for Racial Justice.
