First Scrutiny and Presentation of the Creed

This Sunday, during the 10.00am Mass, we will celebrate the first of three Scrutinies with Levi Roach, who will be baptised at the Easter Vigil. The Scrutinies, which form the last steps as an adult approaches the celebration of baptism, complete the conversion of the Elect (those who have gone through the Rite of Election at the Cathedral) and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all. Following this First Scrutiny, Levi will also be solemnly presented with a copy of the Apostles Creed.

Eucharistic Adoration and the Sacrament of Confession

After Mass on Thursdays at St James during Lent, from 6.30-7.30pm, there will be a time of silent adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as well as another opportunity to celebrate the Sacrament of Confession in addition to 11.30am-12noon on Fridays.

10th Anniversary of the Election of Pope Francis

This Monday, March 13, Pope Francis will be celebrating ten years of his pontificate. To highlight this important anniversary, the Digital Synod has launched a special online map featuring virtual lighted candles representing the prayers of the faithful worldwide for him. Communion under Both Kinds and the Sign of Peace



As we become more used to living with Covid and continue to re-establish our parish and liturgical life, the Bishops of England and Wales have decided that the re-introduction of Holy Communion under both kinds, ie under the form of bread and under the form of wine, will take place from the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on 6 April 2023.

However, it must be stressed that the reception of Holy Communion under both kinds is <u>not obligatory</u> as our Catholic faith teaches that the totality of the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of the Lord is received in either or both kinds. Therefore, it will be for each person to choose whether she or he wishes to receive Holy Communion from the chalice. As before Covid, if you are aware that you are suffering from a cold or similar respiratory symptoms, you are asked to refrain from receiving Holy Communion from the chalice out of respect for others. Please note that it is NOT permitted for anyone in the congregation to "intinct" or dip their Host into the chalice when they come to receive Holy Communion. The Precious Blood must be drunk directly from the chalice or Communion received in one kind only.

Likewise, whilst respecting the wishes of those around you who may still now feel comfortable physically touching another person, we are now being encouraged to once again to extend our hand to those nearest to us when we offer the Sign of Peace.
