Following the recent screening of "The Letter" in our parish, those who attended decided to meet up on Saturday 30 September to discuss how to respond concretely to its message. They were all very moved by the film and the diverse

situations the participants represented but also how they formed a strong bond with each other. As a result, the decision was made to set up a Laudate Si' Group in our parish and come up with ways of highlighting action needed to be taken by individuals, the parish and the wider community. There will be a regular monthly meeting of the Group on the first Saturday of each month at 4.30pm in the parish hall.

The parish Group will become part of the worldwide network under the umbrella of the <u>Laudato Si' Action Platform</u>, which is sponsored by the Vatican Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development. Its latest Newsletter is attached to the Newsletter, as is Pope Francis' recent, hard-hitting Apostolic Exhortation, *Laudate Deum*, on the Climate Crisis.

Cullompton School Pastors

Do you care about the wellbeing of our young people in Cullompton and wish you could do something that helps and supports them? If so, then the ideal opportunity is to become involved with Cullompton School Pastors. New people of any age and



attending any church in the area are always welcome to become part of the team that goes into school to provide pastoral support at a breakfast and lunch club (approximately an hour's commitment). You may feel that is not for you. If so, then there are two additional options for you: to join the management committee or become a prayer pastor. As a committee member there are usually four meetings of an hour and a half a year with some communication and discussion via email in between. There are currently only four people on the committee and would be in the position of having to cease activities if it fell below that number, so please take a moment to think and pray to see if you might be called to contribute just a few hours a year to help. As a prayer pastor you would commit to praying at home for the duration of the session that is going on at school — and no training is needed!
