Response to the Conflict in the Middle East

"The number of victims is growing and the situation in Gaza is desperate." Speaking at his weekly General Audience, the Holy Father also said: *"War solves no problems,"* he said. *"It only sows death and destruction, increases hatred, multiplies revenge. War erases the future; it erases the future."* He urged all believers to take one side only: that of peace. In this regard, Pope Francis invited everyone to observe a **Day of Prayer, Fasting, and Penance for Peace** this coming Friday, 27 October. St James' Church will again be open from 6.00-8.00pm for Adoration before the Blessed Sacrament and a Prayer Vigil at 7.00pm.
