Homelessness – How are we called to respond?

Catholic Social Teaching reminds us that housing is not a valueless system, but a core part of what it means to live a dignified human life. Cardinal Vincent Nichols has said that "the provision of secure, decent housing for all is a hallmark of a good society". Yet, on any given night, tens of thousands of families and individuals are experiencing the worst forms of homelessness across the UK. This includes more than 200,000 households in England alone.

This online event of prayer and reflection, which will take place on Wednesday 17 January 2024, 6.00-7.00pm, will include presentations from organisations working on the frontline of homelessness, including St Petrocs in Cornwall and Routes to Roots in Dorset. They will share their response to the enormous challenge of homelessness and provide suggestions about how we can best respond. All are welcome to take part. Modern Slavery – It's happening near you.

Modern slavery is a serious crime being committed across the UK in which victims are exploited for someone else's gain. It can take many forms, including trafficking of people, forced labour and servitude. Victims are often hidden away, may be unable to leave their situation or may not come forward because of fear or shame. This two-hour event will hear from a range of speakers about



modern slavery in our Diocese and what response we can give. There will be practical advice about what to look out for and what we can do if we have concerns. The event will take place on the Feast of St Bakhita, Patron of victims of modern slavery, on Thursday 6 February, 10.30am-12.30pm at the Church of the Assumption Parish Rooms, Abbey Road, Torquay TQ2 5NJ, and will be followed by a free light lunch.
