Canon Paul Cummins continues as the Diocesan Administrator. A canonical process is currently underway, and no further comments will be made until this process has been concluded. Canon Christopher Whitehead has stepped back from active ministry whilst this process is ongoing." Canon Paul added: "May I ask that you keep Canon Christopher in your prayers and please continue to pray for those responsible for choosing a bishop for us. Please continue to keep me and our Diocese in your prayers".
